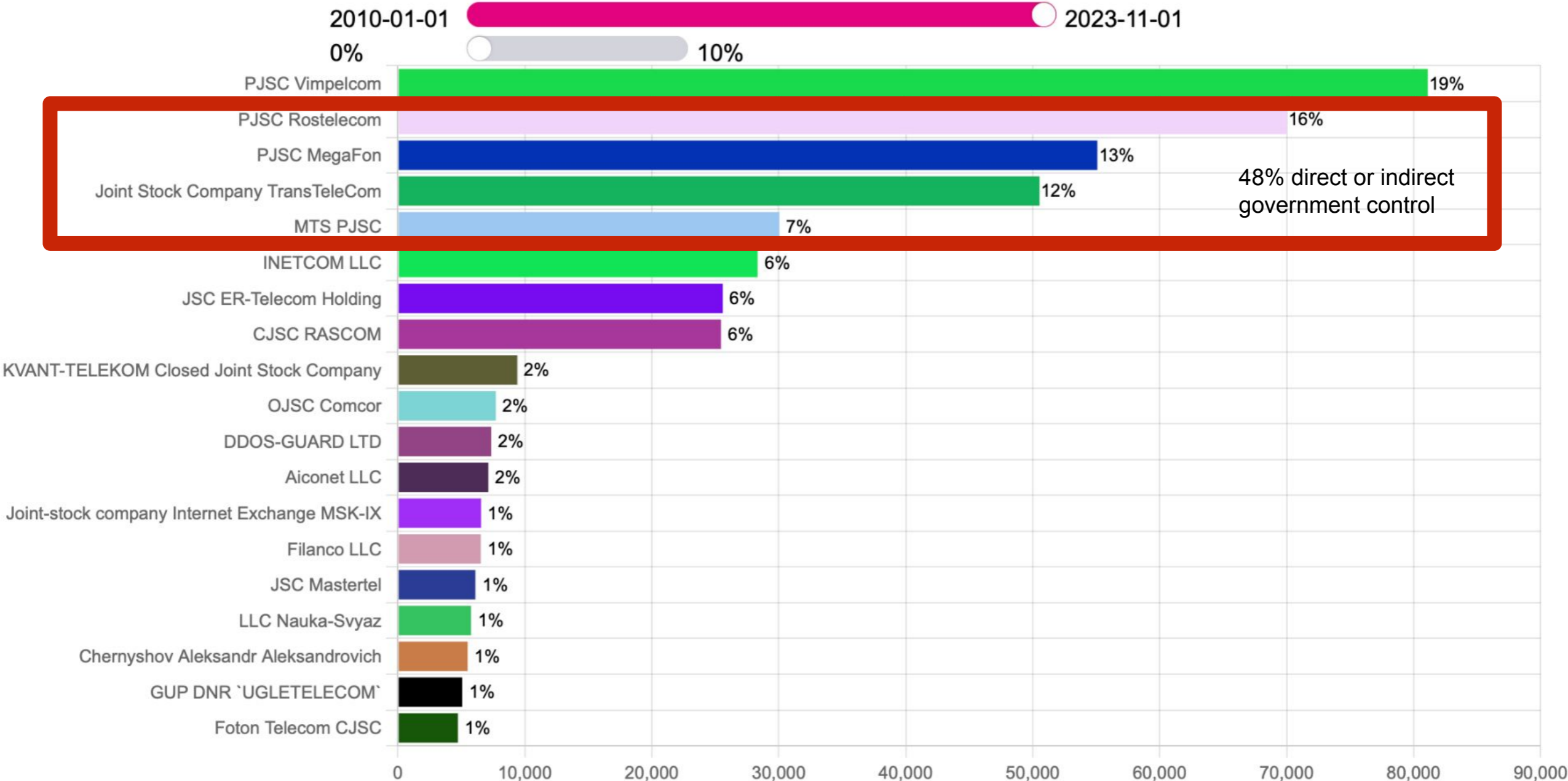

What's the deal with the YouTube?

- One of the few remaining unblocked channels of independent content
- Reach (Sept'23): **94.7 mln (77.8%** of the adult population)
- Bigger than TV (Feb'23): **72.5%**
- RuTube got irreversibly hacked in May 2022
- Now Vkontakte tries to slay the king of content
- In the “Bread and Circuses” YouTube is THE CIRCUS
- and there's a *Price to Pay*.

Conclusions

1. Splinternet and a self-isolated self-centered network look like Kremlin's connectivity endgame;
2. But so far, it doesn't look like that this strategy is achieved through hard control over ISPs;
3. Pseudo legalist regime coupled with relatively cheap commodity DPI allows to have both some control over content and a visibility of market economy.
4. We won't see significant changes until the regime finalizes its megaproject of creating the whole set of its local consumer infrastructures.
